Notes from Kerry

Of Stewardship and Thanksgiving

So here I am in hotel room (a nice one, I must say) near the harbor in Baltimore. Cindy and I are just back from our adventure on the high seas and we're attending a national denominational meeting for leaders of the PCUSA. And, of all things, I just got back from a workshop on "Improvisation in The Midst of Transition". More about that in a minute...

First, though, I want to say that I am thankful. I am thankful to serve a congregation like ours that not only allows me vacation time but encourages me to take it. And the same is true for my Continuing Education time (like this weekend in Baltimore). I am thankful that I have been able to carve out a vocation and answer a call through ministry (and academics- my other "job"). God has provided me so many opportunities that listing them all might fill the rest of this newsletter. I have the most awesomest spouse and kids. I've travelled all over our country,to Europe, and to Israel. For the most part, I've spent my life doing what I want to do when I want to do it. How blessed I am! So, I am thankful indeed.

I'm betting that many of you all feel that you are well-blessed, too. On the great ledger of life, you have been given many assets. And not just given, but you've worked for them as well. Still, though, the opportunity came to you and you had the resources to move forward: to go to that school, to get that job, to take that trip, to get the treatment you needed, etc. And so thanksgiving is not just a national holiday but an important part of our devotional life and our relationship with God.

We don't do it just so that we can pay the insurance bill and the electric bill (and for my vacation time!), but so that we all together can better follow Jesus Christ and his command that we love our neighbors. Sure, the money is important, but not nearly as important the people whose lives we can touch through our church's ministries. Are there lots of other charitable organizations that you can work with and give your treasure to? Absolutely. Cindy and I, for instance, are owners at the Neighborhood Co-op and supporters of WSIU. But the church exists both to help people and to bring honor to God. Stewardship is the practice of making our God-given resources do as much work for the Kingdom of God that they can.

And now back to Improvisation. One of the key tenets of improvisation in live performance is "Yes, and...". That is, when one performer makes a suggestion and creates a situation, the partner says yes, let's do that and let's build on that and take the situation in a new direction. That is what our Interim time is about: partnering with one another (and with God) and discovering some potential new directions that our ministries may take. It's exciting, it's fun, and it's even risky. And for all of that, this November, I am full of thanks.



CARBONDALE WARMING CENTER

The Warming Center's mission is to "provide nighttime sleeping space on cold nights as a supplement to Carbondale's existing shelter system, for the sake of human dignity, safety, and survival." The Warming Center will open this year around December 1, in a new and improved location, in a building owned by the city of Carbondale at 608 E. College. The Warming Center needs help getting the building ready at a clean-up day Saturday, November 2, at 9:00 a.m. Our Mission Ministry team has already donated \$500 to the Warming Center, and the clean-up day is another way that we can support this important community resource.

Last year, the Warming Center was open 72 nights, and served 57 individuals (20 women) for a total of 618 stays (an average of 10.8 nights per person). On an average night, there were between 3 and 15 guests (average of 8.6). The Warming Center had 5 paid staff, 2 interns, and 17 volunteers. In 1889 Presbyterian membership was still growing. There was a membership of 189.

There were 6 ruling elders, 3 deacons and 14 teachers. Including non-members and children, the average attendance was also about 189.
