

Trigger: The Ripple Effects of Gun Violence (Movie and Faith Dialogues)



Mission Ministry is ready to launch the Carbondale Laundry Project, beginning **Tuesday**, **November 12**, and continuing the second Tuesday of each month at Laundry World (corner of University and W. College). This project provides free laundry services for homeless individuals in our community (and other people facing financial challenges), and is supported by the Sparrow Coalition and the Carbondale Interfaith Council.

Here's what we need to get started:

- ☐ Volunteers to assist from 10 a.m. to 2 p.m. (we'll provide training)
- Donations of laundry detergent, dryer sheets, and bleach
- Quarters for the washers and dryers

Please contact Mission Elders, Lily Vucinic or Rick Jefferson, if you are interested in becoming a laundry volunteer or donating supplies, and watch for donation bins at church.



Beginning mid-October, we will have Equal Exchange fair trade coffee, tea, and chocolate available to purchase on Sunday mornings in Fellowship Hall. This is the same brand of coffee served during Fellowship, but available in 12 oz. bags of drip grind or beans. Equal Exchange is a nonprofit organization that supports small farmers and producers, and our purchases support the Presbyterian Hunger Program as well as local mission projects. 

FAITH DIALOGUES IN OCTOBER

he month of October is devoted to the problem of gun violence, by viewing *Trigger: The Ripple Effect of Gun Violence*, a video produced by PC-USA. This documentary examines the ripple effect that a single shooting has on survivors, family, community, and society. "It is a story told from the perspective of those who have been directly impacted and those who are called daily to respond to this ongoing tragedy. The documentary frames gun violence as both a disaster and a public health issue, and addresses the critical issue of gun violence prevention by moving the conversation away from the polarizing extremes that have long dominated the debate and lifting up the voice and experiences of those who seek common ground and a new way forward" (description from the film's website). Each Sunday, we will view and discuss a portion of the video. Please join us for this important topic.



Our first "Ask the Elders" gathering, held September 15, during Faith Dialogues, was a great success. Several topics were discussed, including the timing and process of searching for a permanent pastor, the efforts of a church health and safety committee, and issues related to building security and ongoing maintenance. Our goal is to be more transparent with what occurs during Session meetings and to encourage open communication between the church leadership and the rest of the congregation. We plan to hold similar meetings once per quarter, with the next one scheduled for January 2020.








Sharon and Phil Wittke have joined us via transfer from the Cobden Presbyterian Church. Be sure to meet them and welcome them to First Presbyterian.
