Notes from Kerry for June 2021

So What's Next?

I am writing this in the afterglow of a wonderful Pentecost worship service yesterday (5/23) that included folks in-person on the church's greenspace as well connected via Zoom from their homes. Almost seventy persons were in attendance and/or participated in the service. That is wonderful and very encouraging indeed.

The session and its component ministries have been busy, I assure you, thinking about and planning for the future. Specifically, I mean the day when we gather together to worship again in the church building. Right now, that day looks like it will be Sunday, July 4.

I also want you to be ready for some of the new realities that we will experience when we again worship in the sanctuary. [Let me also say that these are "probabilities" not "definites". Since all our practices and protocols are based on the local Covid-19 metrics and the CDC guidelines, what I am about to write may need to be updated before 7/4 rolls around.] But, *probably*:

We will be recommending that everyone who attends worship wear masks.
We will be taking attendance information so that we can help with contact tracing, if necessary.
We will not have congregational singing, at least initially.
We will be practicing social distancing.
We will maintain an online way for persons to attend worship. Zoom may be replaced over time. But I imagine we will maintain an online presence moving forward.
We will not fellowship in Fellowship Hall but will encourage folks to socialize outside if the weather is accommodating.
We will be practicing extra cleaning and sanitizing of the worship space and the bathrooms.
Child-care will again be provided.

As the session has guided us throughout the pandemic, their biggest concern has been the health of the congregation, the staff, the preschool and daycare programs, and the public who uses our building. The same guiding principle is at work here. We are trying to do everything we can to welcome folks back while minimizing the risk of exposure to Covid-19 as much as possible.

There is no doubt that these practices will change and revise over time. We certainly hope that with increased rates of vaccination in our local population a return to the old "normal" will become more likely. But we are not there yet. It will serve us well to remain patient and to celebrate each positive step as we take it.

Please be assured that all of us on staff and on session will make it a top priority to keep you informed regaing any changes in safety practices here at the church. It would seem logical that the building itself will be opening for small group and public use after we become confident that our revised worship protocols are in fact working as hoped. We'll let you know about that as well.

It is another exciting time in the life of our congregation. God continues to lead us. We are learning to adapt to new situations, and that learning will most certainly continue in the weeks and months ahead.

Thank you for your faithful perseverance in your service of Jesus Christ in the past, in the present, and in the times to come.

We have time to fit in one more outdoor, in-person worship service before our likely return to inside worship this summer.

Sunday, June 13 at 9:30 a.m. we again will hold our worship service on the lawn of the church, and **we will also Zoom the service** at the same time for those who prefer to remain at home.

We will observe Holy Communion during the service, and individually prepackaged elements will be available. If you prefer, you may bring your own Communion elements.

As with past outdoor services, we are recommending social distancing and mask-wearing for everyone's health and safety.

In case of bad weather, an email will be sent via the congregation's alert email letting everyone know we are reverting to the Zoom service. Childcare will not be offered, but children are welcome to attend with their families.

For those who prefer to attend via Zoom, we will share the outdoor service with you as it is happening.

Along with Session and other Ministries, The Worship Ministry has been planning for a safe and joyful return to indoor worship this summer.

As we work through the details, we will keep the congregation informed and engaged. We welcome everyone to attend our first inside, in-person service in more than a year, but for those who may not feel comfortable with in-person worship, there will still be the option to attend via Zoom.



Have you or someone you know been unable to join us this year during our Zoom Worship? Would you like to but don't own a computer or have the capabilities to tune in to our services?

On the other hand, do you own a portable device (laptop, tablet, smart phone) and consider yourself a Zoom-Wizard? OK, so if you're not a Zoom-Wizard, are you able to tune in on Sunday mornings with little difficulty? The Worship Ministry is looking for a way to bring these two groups together.

How many of us remember Bookmobiles? For those who may have forgotten, Bookmobiles were traveling libraries, providing a wide choice of reading material and the excitement of reading to those individuals who didn't have easy access to libraries. Worship Ministry will continue providing an on-line option for our worship services, even though we will be worshiping in-person soon. With our "Zoommobile" program, we hope to extend these Zoom services to those who haven't been able to worship with us due to a lack of available technology or physical ability.

If you know of someone who lives in an assisted living facility or who you feel would appreciate this mobile service, please contact one of the Worship Elders so we can add you to our list. Likewise, if you have a portable device and are willing to visit someone living in an assisted living facility or one who is unable to attend on a Sunday morning, please contact us. There is no age requirement for Zoom-Wizards - thanks!





MEMBERSHIP MINISTRY

Who doesn't like receiving a personalized piece of mail which <u>isn't</u> a bill, solicitation or form letter? This summer, Membership Ministry invites you to keep in touch with your church family via a couple of "snail mail" projects using the good ole' U.S.

First, this month watch your mailbox for a letter containing a postage-paid envelope which has been randomly pre-addressed to another church member or household. Place into the envelope your personalized words of greeting; a favorite family recipe; a newspaper or magazine article; or perhaps a leaf, dried flowers or some other small treasure with a note. After you drop this into the mail, be on the lookout for another's greetings for your household.

Second, those who are interested in ongoing mail correspondence with church members may sign up for the Round Robin letter project. Participants may share all sorts of information in the letters—such as how you've spent your time during the pandemic, updates about family (grandchildren, etc.), amusing anecdotes about your pets, and the like. Participants will receive an initial letter from a church member, with instructions to add their own story and forward both letters to the next name and address on the list. Letters will then continue to circulate throughout the circle of participants.


Here is	a quick list of the Session's discussions and actions:						
	We accepted two resignations:						
	o David King as Clerk of Session						
	o Jonathan Brooks from Session (Fellowship Ministries)						
	We had a long and detailed discussion about the possibility of returning to in-person worship in the church building. (There are articles elsewhere in this newsletter that touch on this discussion.)						
	We continued our discussion about the sanctuary organ. Bill Schwegman asked Wicks Organ Company (Highland, IL) to look at the organ and give us a repair estimate. While here they got the organ into "playable" condition and will provide a written report suggesting future restoration possibilities and cost estimates.						
	We discussed and voted to form a Small Group that will focus on educating, inspiring, and promoting earth-friendly activities for the church and the community						
	We accepted the April financial reports and session minutes						
	We voted to take advantage of the Ameren incentive program to replace all of the church's fluorescent and incandescent lights (not including the sanctuary) with LED light bulbs. The total cost will look like this:						
	Initial cost of replacement bulbs = \$13,450						
	■ Rebate from Ameren = <u>\$4,571</u>						
	■ Total cost= \$ 8,879						
	 Amount of time for electric savings to pay for LEDs = 3 years 						
	Worship Ministries requested moving our June outdoor worship to 6/13						
	I will be taking some vacation and continuing education time during July and August this summer


