#### **Lighting of the Advent Wreath**

Reader: God has given us the perfect gift — Jesus, Emmanuel — God with us. The angels brought good news of comfort and the promise that Jesus is coming to save us from our sins. With joy, we wait for the promise of Emmanuel — God with us.

Light the first candle.

Reader: As prophets predicted, we remember the stories and proclaim the ways Jesus comforts us and brings good news to our world.

Light the second candle.

Reader: We wait for the coming of the Christ-child who brings hope To a world in need and gladness to those with sad hearts. May we hear the words of the prophet to our generation.

Light the third candle. (The pink one.)

#### **New Testament Lesson:**

1 Thessalonians 5:12-28

Minister: <sup>12</sup>But we appeal to you, brothers and sisters, to respect those who labor among you, and have charge of you in the Lord and admonish you; <sup>13</sup>esteem them very highly in love because of their work. Be at peace among yourselves. <sup>14</sup>And we urge you, beloved, to admonish the idlers, encourage the faint hearted, help the weak, be patient with all of them. <sup>15</sup>See that none of you repays evil for evil, but always seek to do good to one another and to all.
